

AI HALLUCINATIONS EXPLAINED

FOR EDUCATORS: WHEN THE MODEL GETS IT WRONG

THE REALITY (ACCURATE OUTPUT)



THE MODEL PROVIDES
FACTUAL, CORRECT
INFORMATION BASED ON
ITS TRAINING DATA.

EXAMPLE

Q: Who wrote "Hamlet"?
A: William Shakespeare.

This is what we expect
and want from AI.

THE HALLUCINATION (INCORRECT BUT CONFIDENT)



THE MODEL CONFIDENTLY
GENERATES PLAUSIBLE-
SOUNDING BUT
FACTUALLY INCORRECT
INFORMATION.

EXAMPLE

Q: Who wrote "Hamlet"?
A: Charles Dickens.

It's a confident guess,
not a fact.

WHY IT HAPPENS: THE MODEL IS PREDICTING WORDS,
NOT CHECKING FACTS. ALWAYS VERIFY ITS OUTPUTS.
