

# AI HALLUCINATIONS EXPLAINED

## FOR EDUCATORS: WHEN THE MODEL GETS IT WRONG

### THE REALITY (ACCURATE OUTPUT)



THE MODEL PROVIDES  
FACTUAL, CORRECT  
INFORMATION BASED ON  
ITS TRAINING DATA.

#### EXAMPLE

**Q:** Who wrote "Hamlet"?  
**A:** William Shakespeare.

This is what we expect  
and want from AI.

### THE HALLUCINATION (INCORRECT BUT CONFIDENT)



THE MODEL CONFIDENTLY  
GENERATES PLAUSIBLE-  
SOUNDING BUT  
FACTUALLY INCORRECT  
INFORMATION.

#### EXAMPLE

**Q:** Who wrote "Hamlet"?  
**A:** Charles Dickens.

It's a confident guess,  
not a fact.

**WHY IT HAPPENS:** THE MODEL IS PREDICTING WORDS,  
NOT CHECKING FACTS. ALWAYS VERIFY ITS OUTPUTS.
